Naomi Yoeli

Born in Jerusalem in 1950, Naomi Yoeli is an Israeli independent theatre director, performer and researcher. Based in Tel Aviv, Yoeli has been involved in many aspects of theatre, including dramaturgy, live performance and play writing as well as puppetry and storytelling.

Yoeli has a PhD (Summa cum laude) in Theatre Studies from Tel-Aviv University (2002) and has since been researching and teaching "Ceremonies as theatrical phenomena". She has been a member of the artistic committee of Acco Festival (2000-2004) and the dramaturge and artistic consultant of Train Theatre, Jerusalem (1995-2015). She is currently teaching Performance Studies at the M.A program at the theatre department of Haifa University.

In her performances, solo and collaborative, Yoeli investigates private histories, personal memories and traumas vs. the "big histories", collective memory, rituals and ceremonies.

Yoeli has collaborated with the Ruth Kanner Theatre Group, the Arena Theatre in Jerusalem and many independent artists, and has performed and led workshops in various set-ups and festivals, both in Israel and abroad.
